




# Do I Have Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)?



STEP	<p><b>1</b> I think my ash tree may be infested with Emerald Ash Borer.</p> <p>→ Go to step #3</p>	 
STEP	<p><b>2</b> I suspect I have seen an Emerald Ash Borer.</p> <p>→ Go to step #5</p>
